It's hard to believe that in July of 2016, I started as the first Executive Director of The Arc of Southwest Colorado which has been the most rewarding job of my career. I am so proud of where we have come as an organization and I am thrilled to be celebrating ten years of advocating for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities this Fall!

We have gone from serving 45 students annually with our core programming, Education Advocacy, to serving over 100 students annually. In addition to this work, we also host educational workshops, parent support groups, ongoing educational and social activities for adults living with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including Speaking for Ourselves, a self advocacy group, AND we just completed year two of our Camp Peak Energy summer camp where we served 26 campers age 5-18 doubling our numbers from the the first camp in June 2023. I am so proud of how our programming has grown and the impact we are making! As we are only ten years old, we still have a lot of work to do. I look forward to continuing to share all that we are doing with you. In the meantime, please enjoy recapping with us what we have been up to the last year. I am so grateful to all of you for your support over the last ten years and also to the staff and board of directors for their commitment to such an amazing organization that I am honored to be a part of.

The Arc is the largest national community-based organization advocating for and serving people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. We encompass all ages and more than 100 different diagnoses including autism, Down syndrome, Fragile X syndrome, and various other developmental disabilities. There are over 600 chapters in the United States, 15 of them across the state of Colorado.

Education Advocacy

The goal of our Education Advocacy programming is to facilitate communication between families and school teams to ensure that students with intellectual and developmental disabilities are educated in the Least Restrictive Environment and their IEP's and 504's are being followed. Throughout the past year, The Arc of Southwest Colorado has had the privilege of supporting over 100 families, spanning from Pagosa Springs to Dove Creek. We have achieved milestones, including navigating the identification, evaluation, and IEP process, resolving conflicts between schools and families, and collaborating with schools to provide the best possible support for your student in the Least Restrictive Environment. Additionally, we have assisted numerous students in transitioning from high school to adult services, paving the way for continued success beyond graduation. We have served students with diagnosis's from ADHD to Autism and Down's Syndrome.

Looking ahead, we are excited to announce our plans for a hands-on workshop called HOW. This workshop will cater to all ages and cover a wide range of topics, including IEPs, transitions, guardianship & alternatives, benefits, and more.



Our community outreach has been extensive. We attended events such as Boker Games, Montezuma Games, 9R's Fall & Spring Resource Fairs with hundreds of attendees, and the Future's Fair in Cortez. Additionally, we initiated a Family Resource Collaborative with community partners to further support our mission.

By continually expanding our social and educational activities, we are creating vibrant, supportive environments where individuals can learn, grow, and connect with the community. Our goal is to build on these successes and offer even more diverse and impactful programs in the coming year, encouraging not just inclusion, but real belonging.

ADULT SERVICES/SOCIAL AND EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

This year, our Adult Services have provided enriching social and educational activities, fostering personal growth and community engagement. Through our Speak Up Classes, Speaking For Ourselves Group, Cooking and Art Classes, Movie and Game Days, Adult Advocacy Program, and other community outings, we have served around 50 adults with IDD.

Speak Up Colorado

The Speak Up class is designed to teach people with disabilities receiving Home and Community Based Services to lead their lives through the creation of their own Person Driven Plan.



Our participants have shared how impactful our classes have been. One individual noted, "What I am learning from class so far is that it's OK to make mistakes. And to advocate for what I need and we're all human and nobody's perfect." Another shared, "What I learned from the class is to stand up for myself and advocate for myself what I need." These testimonials highlight the confidence and selfadvocacy skills our participants are developing.

GAME DAY

We continue to hold Game Day in Durango weekly and this year added a monthly Game Day in Cortez. We average 15 participants each week and Uno is still the favorite!



Speaking For Ourselves



Speaking for Ourselves is our self advocacy group that meets monthly. It is a space where participants learn how to impact change and give back to the community. This year our Walkathon raised \$1,000 for The Hive with an average of 9 walkers each week in May. Annually we participate in the Festival of Trees. Our creative efforts won us 2nd place for Best Theme!

Cooking & Art Classes





Camp Peak Energy




